### Getting Started

Create an RBDigital Gateway account using your library card.

- If you already have a Zinio account, just login using the email and password you use for Zinio digital magazines.
- Otherwise, go to the library's RBDigital Gateway page at:

- Click on the **Create New Account** link in the top right corner of the screen.
- Enter your **Library card number** and click **Next**.
- Finish creating your account by filling in the **requested fields**.

Browse the film collection by audience – family, teen, or adult – or by genre such as animations, romance, sci-fi, documentaries etc. Or you can search by actor, director, or title. Click on the movie to watch the trailer or the full feature.

### FILMS

**Howl** (2010; Starring James Franco & Jon Hamm)

As Allen Ginsberg talks about his life & art, his most famous poem is illustrated in animation while the trial of the work is dramatized.

**Rhythm of the Saints** (2003)

A touching story about a streetwise Latina that provides a thoughtful glimpse into an urban teenage world.

**Wendy & Lucy** (2008)

A woman's life is derailed en route to a potentially lucrative summer job. When her car breaks down, and her dog is taken to the pound, the thin fabric of her financial situation comes apart, and she is led through a series of increasingly dire economic decisions.

### CLASSIC MOVIES

**Made for Each Other** (1939; Starring Carole Lombard and James Stewart)  
Newlywed struggle.

**Oliver Twist** (1948; United Kingdom)  
Based on the Charles Dickens novel about an orphan boy who runs away from a workhouse and meets a pickpocket on the streets of London.

**Battleship Potemkin** (1925; Foreign)  
A dramatized account of a great Russian naval mutiny and a resulting street demonstration which brought on a police massacre.

**The General** (1926; Starring Buster Keaton)  
When Union spies steal an engineer's beloved locomotive, he pursues it single-handedly and straight through enemy lines.

**Beat the Devil** (1953; Starring Humphrey Bogart)  
On their way to Africa are a group of rogues who hope to get rich there.

**The Magnificent Seven** (1960; Starring Yul Brynner, Steve McQueen & Charles Bronson)  
An oppressed Mexican peasant village assembles seven gunfighters to help defend their homes.

**Moulin Rouge** (1952; Starring Jose Ferrer & Zsa Zsa Gabor; Directed by John Huston)  
A fictional account of the French artist Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec.

**One-Eyed Jacks** (1961; Starring & Directed by Marlon Brando)  
Running from the law after a bank robbery in Mexico, Dad Longworth finds an opportunity to take the stolen gold and leave his partner Rio to be captured.

**Young Mr. Lincoln** (1939; Starring Henry Fonda; Directed by John Ford)  
A fictionalized account of the early life of the American president as a young lawyer facing his greatest court case.

**Young at Heart** (1954; Starring Frank Sinatra, Doris Day & Gig Young)  
The lives and romances of three sisters in a musical family; the youngest daughter's life is complicated by the subsequent arrival of a charming composer and a cynical music arranger.

### DOCUMENTARIES

**Up Heartbreak Hill** (2012)  
A moving look at a new generation of Americans struggling to be both Native and modern.

**Tesla: Master of Lightning** (2000)  
Recounts the life of scientist, inventor, and visionary Nikola Tesla

**My Lai** (2010)  
Examines one of the darkest chapters of the Vietnam War, the 1968 My Lai massacre, its cover-up and the soldiers who broke rank to halt the atrocities.

**Jack Kerouac: King of the Beats** (1985)  
Award winning documentary about the author of the classic novel "On The Road".

**Inventing David Geffen** (2012)  
David Geffen's far-reaching influence -- as agent, manager, record industry mogul, Hollywood and Broadway producer, and philanthropist -- has helped shape American popular culture for the past four decades.

**The Hidden Child** (2006)  
Documentary focusing on the life of Maud Dahme, one of the thousands of Jewish children who were hidden by Dutch Christians from the Nazi's during the German occupation of the Netherlands.

**The Apple Pushers** (2011)  
This film follows the inspiring stories of five immigrant pushcart vendors who are rolling fresh fruits and vegetables into New York City's food deserts - neighborhoods where finding a ripe, red apple is a serious challenge.
