Rain gardens are designed to capture precipitation and stormwater runoff so it recharges the aquifer and keeps pollutants out of our streams. They also provide habitat for native pollinators and add beauty. Come learn the basic function and design of rain gardens, including size and placement, soil amendment, and choices of native plantings. Kristie will also go over the basic River Friendly certification activities as most of them apply to landscaping and gardening. She will provide resources so you can create your own rain garden.
