



Spring Activities of the Native Americans of Central New Jersey

Jim will discuss the significance and importance of the Indian way of life during the spring season, focusing on the activities of planting, hunting and gathering, tool making, and religious ceremonies. Special emphasis will be on the spring fish run as the Native Americans began preparing their fish-nets and weirs for the return of the fish from the ocean to the rivers and streams to lay their eggs.

Jim Wade is an Archaeology Archivist who was the Special Project Assistant at the N.J. State Museum researching 17th and 18th Century New Jersey land deeds of the Delaware-Lenape Indians.
